## INSPECTION PROCEDURES FOR FULL BODY HARNESS

- 1. Inspect label. If missing or not legible, remove from service.
- 2. Check tag for date of manufacture. If beyond service life, remove from service.
- 3. Inspect dee rings for any cracks or sharp edges/
- 4. Check mating buckle hardware for cracks and sharp edges. Make sure they connect properly.
- 5. If leg straps are tongue & grommet style, inspect grommets to insure they are secure and are not elongated.
- 6. Make sure leg straps do not have extra holes punched into them.
- 7. Inspect impact indicator on back of shoulder strap. If stitching is released, harness has seen a fall.
- 8. Inspect webbing.
  - A) Check for frayed, cut or broken fibers.
  - B) Check for burn marks and abrasion.
  - C) Check for paint buildup.
  - D) Check for chemical or heat damage-Brown, discolored or brittle areas.
  - E) Check for UV damage-Fading and presence of splinters on the webbing.
  - F) Inspect stitching-Check for pulled or cut stitching.
